On Election Day, Citizens of the City of Vienna went to the polls to elect a new Mayor, a Council Member, and consider renewing the E-SPLOST for another 6 years.

Eddie Daniels was elected as Mayor of Vienna. He will be sworn into office on January 13, 2020, at 6:00 p.m. at Vienna City Hall. Daniels previously served a term as Mayor in 2012-2016 and prior to that, served on Vienna City Council for a number of years.

The census counts every person living in the U.S. once, only once, and in the right place.




It's about fair representation.

Every 10 years, the results of the census are used to reapportion the House of Representatives, determining how many seats each state gets.




It's in the Constitution.






Joiner's Corner


